At Westchester Care at Home, a new Care Navigation program is assisting elderly populations with life planning and wellness issues. WCAH also launched new Elite Care services to elevate the quality of life for individuals with complex personal care needs.

The common denominator in the success of all of our programs is our dedicated staff who continue to acquire advanced training and skills that help our patients thrive. We are also grateful to the many individuals and organizations who help sustain our notfor-profit mission through contributions to our VNSW Foundation. 







ADVANCING PATIENT CARE



Screening for Sepsis at Home

Last fall, VNSW's clinical team began screening all patients for signs of sepsis using a new interactive Sepsis Screening, Education and Early Intervention tool. Sepsis, the body's overwhelming response to infection, has been declared a national medical emergency. Our new Sepsis

Screening tool, developed by the Home Care Association of NYS, IPRO, the Sepsis Alliance and the Rory Staunton Foundation, is helping us identify early signs of the condition and engage in interventions to prevent possible organ failure and fatalities. During the last quarter of 2019, over 2,800 patients were screened for sepsis, with close to 100 patients identified with symptoms requiring further intervention by a physician, including 19 patients sent to the hospital ER due to severe symptoms of the disease.

Funding for this program was provided by Aging in America, Inc. and the VNSW Foundation. Inc.

Asthma Home Visiting Program

Supported by a \$10,000 grant from the American Lung Association, VNSW recently launched our Hi-Risk Asthma

Home Visiting Program. Asthma represents a significant risk for the elderly as it can quickly lead to respiratory failure. Funding for this program has enabled us to train our clinical staff to recognize asthma triggers, conduct in-depth assessments and create action plans to reduce patient re-hospitalizations and ER visits. Our home care visits provide the ideal setting to educate patients and families, review medication plans and encourage patient and family participation.

VNSW Pilots Auto-Leasing Program for Clinical Staff

In February, VNSW launched a new auto leasing program through Enterprise Fleet Management to provide safe and reliable transportation for clinical staff delivering vital care for patients at home. Equipped with enhanced driver safety and navigation tools, access to these vehicles will enable our staff to provide more efficient and consistent service to patients residing in the harder-to-reach rural communities we serve in Putnam, Dutchess and Northern Westchester. The provision of company cars to clinicians also promotes staff recruitment and retention at a time when the shortage of nurses and other home care workers OT, Tim Leddy, President/CEO is prevalent throughout the healthcare sector.

New EMR System Planned



In 2019, VNSW identified a new Electronic Medical Record system from Homecare Homebase, which will be implemented in the coming months. The new system will help VNSW improve efficiencies in agency work flows, such as scheduling of in-home visits, and enable us to better track and report on patient health status and outcomes. Utilizing advanced EMR

technologies is an important means of enhancing the quality of patient care and sharing data with other health providers to ensure a continuum of care.

VNSW Named to Home Care Elite 2019

VNSW was designated a Top Agency of the 2019 HomeCare Elite®, a recognition of the top-performing home health care agencies in the United States. HomeCare Elite agencies are determined by an analysis of performance measures in quality

outcomes, best practices implementation, patient experience, quality improvement and consistency, and financial health. According to the ABILITY Network which developed the agency ranking system, "VNS Westchester's home health professionals have demonstrated exceptional commitment to care quality and the patient experience."

VNSW/WCAH Re-Accredited by CHAP

VNS Westchester and Westchester Care at Home have been reaccredited by the Community Health Accreditation Program, Inc. (CHAP) through 2022. CHAP accreditation demonstrates that our agencies meet the industry's highest nationally recognized standards in the categories of home care service we provide.

Elite Care Services Launched

Westchester Care at Home (WCAH), an affiliate of VNS Westchester, introduced a new suite of specialty concierge care services to address the complex health and personal care needs of the elderly and other vulnerable populations at home. Elite Care Services provide customized care that fosters safety, independence and dignity among clients, while bringing peace of mind to families. Provided by NY State Certified Home Health Aides with advanced training/certification in Dementia Care, Disease-specific conditions and Customer Service Excellence, Elite Care Services feature comprehensive nursing oversight, geriatric care management, assistance with activities of daily living, a personalized Plan of Care and an in-home safety assessment, among other services.





The new program was introduced at our Breakfast Buffet and Fall Fashion Show at Kanopi atop the Ritz-Carlton in White Plains last September, with 50 healthcare colleagues attending.

New Care Navigation Program Introduced

Westchester Care at Home is partnering with the Congregation of Notre Dame (CND) to provide comprehensive life planning, care management and wellness services for Sisters residing in CND's congregate settings in New York. The program offers a wide range of health care management, personal care and social support services, including the creation of individual life plans, accompanying the Sisters to physician, ER and hospital visits and assistance with enrolling in entitlement services. The goal of the program is to help CND's Sisters maintain the best possible quality of life and to successfully age in place.

NYSDOL Grant for Home Health Aide Training

WCAH received a grant from the NYS Department of Labor to provide free Home Health Aide Certification Training to unemployed individuals from the Bronx and Lower Westchester. Successful completion of the 13-day program leads to NYS Certification as a Home Health Aide and job opportunities at WCAH. Free round-trip transportation and gift cards for completing the program are among program incentives offered. The program is ongoing through spring 2020, with multiple classes offered.

New affiliation with NYU's School of Nursing

VNSW has been chosen as a clinical site for students

Through this collaboration, students will complete a scholarly research project on a critical issue in healthcare under the guidance of a designated mentor from our clinical team. VNSW is proud to collaborate on this program of study that prepares students at the highest academic level for careers in advanced clinical practice and nursing leadership.



Sale of VNSW/WCAH Headquarters

In late 2019, the Westchester Visiting Nurse Services Group, Inc., parent company of VNS Westchester and Westchester Care at Home, sold the building at 360 Mamaroneck Avenue in White Plains that houses both agencies. VNSW and WCAH will continue to rent space in the building while the

search for new quarters is under way. We anticipate moving to new offices in White Plains in fall 2020 which will better accommodate staffing and community needs.



New Dutchess Office

Last May, VNSW opened a new office in Hopewell Junction. The agency decided to relocate our branch office from Putnam to Dutchess County due to the fast-rising growth of patient admissions in Dutchess. The new location in Hopewell Junction

makes it easier to reach patients in the northern counties we serve, and will help us foster new collaborations with local healthcare providers.




